Author of *'The End of Money'* and Contributing Editor, *WIRED*



David Wolman is a nonfiction author and a contributing editor at WIRED. He has also written for publications including the New York Times, Wall Street Journal, Nature, Outside and Time, and his work has been anthologized in the Best American Science Writing series. His long-form feature about revolutionaries in Egypt, "The Instigators," was nominated for a 2012 National Magazine Award for reporting, and his recent profile of a counterfeiter won an Outstanding Feature Writing award from the American Society of Journalists and Authors.

Wolman's latest book, *The End of Money*, is a globetrotting exploration of a topic that many readers have always taken for granted: the cash in their pockets. The book has "gonzo brilliance," says The Guardian, and Amazon editors selected it for their best nonfiction list of 2012. David is a former Fulbright journalism fellow in Japan and graduate of Stanford's journalism program, and his previous books are *A Left-Hand Turn Around the World* and *Righting the Mother Tongue*.
